

They demonstrated how to resolve the xy coordinates of bolt circle holes with examples for 4, 5 and 7 hole circles at a couple of angular offsets.

Stuart steam engine with the help of Frank Kerpsie and his compressed air tank. Pat said this engine is not a model, but a small engine built to power a generator for charging radio batteries on remote island outposts during WWII.
